# **Backpacker Visa Changes To Support Bushfire Recovery**

Backpackers who work in bushfire-affected regions including land clearing and rebuilding fences or homes for three months, will be eligible to stay in Australia for a second year under amended visa rules.

Federal Tourism Minister Simon Birmingham said the expansion of the criteria enabling working holidaymakers to extend their stay in Australia, would help protect jobs in regional areas. "We know tourism businesses in fire-affected communities are doing it tough, and the more tourism dollars that these working holidaymakers can inject into these economies, the quicker these businesses can get back on their feet," he said.

# **Funding And Other Opportunities**

## **REMINDER - Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants**

A reminder the Federal Government's Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants Program is now open. Austrade will administer the program, which has been developed in consultation with the National Bushfire Recovery Agency. Eligible applicants have been sent a link to the application form via email.

Stream 1 will support smaller-scale events (including the promotion of these events). Applicants may apply for more than one grant in this stream, up to a total value of \$30,000 per applicant. Stream 1 applications will close on 20 November 2020.

Stream 2 will support larger events (including the promotion of those events), and/or other visitor attractions such as art installations and tourist walks. Applicants are advised to make their proposals scalable as they may not receive the full amount they are seeking. Stream 2 applications close on 20 March 2020.

We are still working through the mechanics of the program, eligibility and equity and the role of Destination North Coast and will continue to share information as it becomes available.

# **Future Minds Accelerator**

The Future Minds Accelerator is designed to support and inspire startups and the ecosystem to tackle a 21st Century challenge: how can we prepare Australia's young people to thrive in the jobs of the future? Closes 13 March 2020.

#### **Community Halls Program**

Gives back to the local halls that make up the social fabric of regional, rural and remote NSW by providing support to eligible communities to put towards general maintenance costs. Closes 20 March 2020.

#### **Australia-ASEAN Council Grants**

Aims to generate opportunities for Australian business, education, science and innovation and the arts to work with partners in South-East Asia. Closes 26 March 2020.

#### **NAIDOC Local Grants**

Supports communities to celebrate the histories, cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples during NAIDOC Week. Closes 30 March 2020.

### **Volunteer Museum Grant Program - Small Grants**

Aims to meet the short-term, collection-based requirements of community museums and Aboriginal keeping places. Closes 30 March 2020. Please note: Small Grants in 2020 will be

prioritising projects related to bushfire recovery.
