North Coast Business Health Survey - January 2022

Register A Positive Rapid Antigen Test Result

From 12 January 2022, people must register a COVID-19 positive result from a rapid antigen test and can do this through **Service NSW**.

This helps people:

- quickly understand their relative level of risk
- access support from NSW Health

Testing and isolation has changed so it's important for individuals and business owners to keep up to date.

Pandemic Leave Disaster Payment

Support of up to \$750 is available for individuals who are unable to earn an income because you or someone you are caring for has had to self-isolate or quarantine due to COVID-19.

Free Tourism Training On Offer For Holiday Season

Critical skills shortages in the visitor economy are being addressed by the NSW Government, which is offering thousands of free training places across the state.

Minister for Skills and Tertiary Education Geoff Lee has announced more than 2,700 fee-free training places will be available initially across 35 short courses at TAFE NSW and other registered training providers, with scope to increase with demand.

Free courses available under the program include:

- Outdoor Leadership (Basic Water Rescues, Snorkel, Lead Snorkeling, Paddle and Lead Stand Up Board on Inland Flatwater)
- Tourism Product Design and Promotion
- Hospitality (Interact with Customers, Safe Work Practices and Visitor Information, Housekeeping, Responsible Service of Alcohol, Social/Cultural Sensitivity)
- Outdoor Recreation (Vertical Rescues, Abseil, Establish Ropes and Lead Single Pitch Abseiling on Natural Surfaces)
- Bicycle Servicing
- Swimming and Water Safety Teacher
- Infection control

The announcement complements the nearly 250,000 free training places being funded under the joint state and federal JobTrainer program and adds to the NSW Government investment in free training recently announced for the retail and hospitality sectors.

Applications For Land Tax Relief Extended Until February

Applications for land tax relief will be extended until 28 February to give eligible commercial and residential landowners more time to access the program.

NSW landowners may be eligible to receive a reduction of up to 100 per cent of their land tax payable for the 2021 land tax year if they provided a reduction in rent to a tenant between 1 July 2021 and 31 December 2021.

This package follows a similar program run for the 2020 land tax year, which saw more than 17,400 applications received and \$218.8 million of relief provided.

To be eligible for <u>land tax relief</u>, a landowner must be leasing to a commercial tenant who has a turnover up to \$50 million and has been deemed eligible for NSW Government COVID-19 support grants or a residential tenant who has lost 25 per cent or more of household income due to COVID-19.

The landowner must have reduced rent for the affected tenant for any period between 1 July 2021 and 31 December 2021, without any requirement for it to be paid back.

Landlords can also access the <u>Commercial Landlord Hardship Fund</u>, which provides small commercial or retail landlords with a monthly grant up to the value of any rental relief provided, to a maximum of \$3,000 per month per property. To be eligible, a landlord cannot claim land tax relief for rent reductions provided to tenants between 1 July 2021 and 31 December 2021. Applications for the Commercial Landlord Hardship Fund close 31 March 2022.

Minyon Falls Lookout Reopens For Holiday Season


Minyon Falls in Heritage-Listed Nightcap National Park has a spectacular new lookout and viewing platform offering improved access for visitors to experience one of Australia's best waterfalls in the renowned biodiversity hotspot.

The redevelopment of the <u>Minyon Falls Visitor Precinct and Lookout</u> is the first completed stage of a \$7.5 million project to deliver a walking trails network through the hinterland.

Expanded parking, wheelchair accessible tracks and picnic areas, spectacular views and walking trails confirm Minyon Falls as a must-see destination for the region and an attraction that will draw visitors from the coast to the hinterland.

Upgrade works have now commenced at <u>Unicorn Falls in nearby Mount Jerusalem National Park</u>, located approximately 15 kilometres south-east of the village of Uki. The <u>final master plan</u> for the upgrade of this precinct was released in October 2021, after two opportunities for public feedback.





The NSW Government recently announced the purchase of 194 hectares of prime koala habitat located adjacent to the Lake Innes Nature Reserve, south-west of Port Macquarie. This jointly-funded initiative was made possible through the generous contribution of \$3.5 million from Koala Conservation Australia (KCA) as well as from the NSW Government's landmark \$193 million dollar investment in koala conservation. The Koala (Guula) is a totem animal to the Birpai people and maintaining this population is of great cultural and spiritual importance to contemporary Birpai families.

As well as the koala, three additional threatened species (eastern coastal free-tailed bat, glossy black cockatoo and grey-headed flying-fox) have been recorded on the property.

New Look Ballina Byron Gateway Airport

The Ballina Byron Gateway Airport has unveiled its fresh look for the future with the launch of new branding and a **modernised website**.

As one of Australia's busiest regional airports with the majority of inbound passengers arriving for leisure purposes and most outbound passengers travel for business, the airport has developed fresh branding to reflect its dual purpose as a tourism destination and business travel hub.

The airport carpark is being upgraded to include an additional 100 car parking spaces, dedicated ground transport and rental car parking areas, and a new solar PV system to support the airport's energy needs. The airport terminal is also being expanded to accommodate new security screening equipment and improve access for passengers entering the departure lounge.
