Key Outcomes From Tourism Jobs Summit

Australian Minister for Trade and Tourism Don Farrell this week led a Tourism Jobs Summit in Canberra to discuss ideas for addressing workforce challenges in the visitor economy. Some of the key actions identified were reforming the migration program; encouraging people with a disability and those on an Age Pension into the workforce; incentivising employers to improve on-the-job training; and promoting tourism as a career of choice.

\$5 Million To Activate NSW Heritage

Applications are open for innovative ideas that boost public access to the state's most significant heritage places and stimulate local economies across NSW.

Minister for Heritage James Griffin said \$5 million in funding support is available through the 2023-2025 NSW Heritage Grants program.

The 2023-2025 NSW Heritage Grants program has six categories, including:

- The new Activating State Heritage Grant where one successful applicant will be awarded \$1 million in matched funding
- Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Grants where applicants can apply for up to \$80,000
- Caring for State Heritage Grants where applicants can apply for up to \$150,000
- Community Heritage Grants where applicants can apply for up to \$50,000
- · Emergency Works Grants to help address emergency situations at state significant sites
- Local Government Heritage Grants program designed for NSW local councils.

Insight - How Responsible Tourism Contributes To A More Sustainable Visitor Economy

National Visitor Survey - Monthly Snapshot June 2022

Domestic tourism continued to recover in June 2022. Overnight spend was up 22% on pre-pandemic levels. However, overnight trips were down 14% and nights spent away were down 8%.

Overall Australian residents took 8.4 million overnight trips and spent \$7.5 billion in June 2022.

Room Occupancy Rates & Revenue Rise In NSW

Destination NSW has released its <u>NSW Tourist Accommodation Snapshot</u> for April to June 2022. The data has revealed rising occupancy rates throughout NSW.

NSW, Sydney and regional NSW saw rates above the same quarter in 2021 (up 11 per cent, 15 per cent and 1 per cent respectively).

Regional NSW held the lion's share of the state's properties (77 per cent) and a slightly larger majority of rooms (51 per cent).

North Coast NSW continued to lead regional NSW, accounting for 23.3 per cent of establishments and 22.5 per cent of rooms. It also led in terms of room revenue takings in regional NSW, with 22.7 per cent share.

1 in 5 Cruise Passengers Return to Port

New research from Destination NSW has shown that approximately 20% of cruise visitors return independently to ports they visit on cruises.

The trend was highlighted in a new guide from Destination NSW, <u>Quick Tips for Creating Cruise Shore Experiences</u>, which provides practical tips to help businesses tailor experiences and sell them through the cruise distribution network.

Assisting visitor economy stakeholders such as tour operators, attractions and retailers, the guide was created in partnership with the Port Authority of NSW and presents opportunities like selling exclusive and tailored cruise experiences to cruise ship passengers in ports; building awareness of the destination and its experiences; and inspiring high-value travellers to create positive word of mouth and book return visits.

Hospitality Spending Surges In NSW

July data from the <u>Australian Bureau of Statistics</u> has revealed NSW had the highest increase in hotel, cafe and restaurant spending in Australia, up 70.5 per cent through the year. South Australia followed in second place, up 42.8 per cent.

Funding And Other Opportunities

<u>Stronger Country Community Fund Round 5</u>

The Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5 aims to boost the well-being of communities in regional areas by providing new or upgraded social and sporting infrastructure, or community programs that have strong local support. **Closes 23 September 2022.**

Electric Vehicle Destination Charging Grants - Expires Soon

Up to 3500 electric vehicle (EV) chargers will be rolled out across regional NSW, with the NSW Government offering \$20 million in grants to establish Australia's largest destination charging network. **Closes 23 September 2022.**

Festivals Australia

Festivals Australia funds high-quality arts projects that invite community participation and audience engagement. Projects can include but are not limited to a parade, performance, workshop, installation or exhibition.

The aim is to give community members living in regional or remote Australia the chance to participate in or attend an arts experience at a festival, or a significant one-off community celebration. Closes 5 October 2022 for projects commencing from 1 February 2023.

Aboriginal Community And Place Program

Aboriginal community-controlled organisations and groups can apply for funding to meet Closing the Gap targets thanks to the NSW Government's \$30 million Community and Place Grants Program. As part of the NSW Government's 2022-24 Closing the Gap Implementation Plan, grants of up to \$250,000 will be available to fund one-off projects including programs, equipment, vehicles and infrastructure. **Closes 30 September 2022.**

Best Beach Towns In NSW | Urban List Sydney

NSW beaches rival some of the best in the world. Urban List has compiled the <u>10 prettiest beach towns in NSW</u>, with 4 located of the best on the North Coast getting a gong being Byron Bay, Kingscliff, South West Rocks and Yamba.

Short-Term Rental Accommodation Planning Proposal

Byron Shire Council are proposing to reduce non-hosted short-term rental accommodation (STRA) from 180 days to 90-days per year for most of the Byron Shire. For parts of Byron Bay (East and West), Suffolk Park and Brunswick Heads it's proposed to increase STRA to 365-days i.e. all year round.

The STRA Planning Proposal explains the effect and justification for the proposed change. If the changes are supported by Council following consideration of exhibition outcomes, there will be a 12-month transition period for any changes to commence. This means any changes will not come into effect until 2024.

Council has been delegated authority to make the plan subject to the proposal not being amended to reduce non-hosted STRA period on any land to less than 90 days. Provide feedback on the proposal via the **<u>Byron Shire Council survey</u>** that is open until 31 October 2022.

In addition to the Byron Shire Council survey, the Byron Bay Chamber of Commerce are also requesting deedback on the issue. The Byron Bay Chamber of Commerce survey is open until 19 September 2022.

Mulga's Longest Public Mural At Flynns Beach

Internationally renowned public artist 'Mulga' has finished his Port Macquarie-Hastings Council-commissioned piece covering over 100m of wall at Flynns Beach. It's super colourful and full of his usual cheeky humour. A number of talented local artists also helped with the installation, which is definitely one for the Instagram.

Nimbin's Rainbow Road Walking Track

The Nimbin Rainbow Road Walking Track is finally coming to fruition, and Lismore City Council are <u>looking for feedback</u>. Now they have a preliminary design, Council is seeking input on what this walking track will look like and how it may best serve the community of Nimbin and provide a wonderful tourist attraction for visitors to the township of Nimbin.

The project includes concrete pathways, lighting, interpretive signage, way-finding signage, artwork, small bridges erected over the nearby creek system, park furniture and native plantings, more than 1km long for the community of Nimbin and its visiting tourists.

The total budget of \$2.5 million is fully funded by the NSW Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund (BLERF).

Alfresco Restart Rebate:

Small and medium food and beverage businesses have until tomorrow, 16 September to register for the NSW Government's <u>Alfresco</u> <u>Restart rebate</u>. The rebate of up to \$5000 can be used to create, expand or improve outdoor dining areas. Eligible businesses can claim for expenses incurred between 14 October 2021 to 30 September 2022.

Northern Rivers Rail Trail - Product & Experience Development Resources

Tourism businesses interested in developing a rail trail focused product or experience in the Northern Rivers can access a free <u>Online</u> <u>Education Program</u> via Ispring available until 16 November 2022.

New Program To Get Wine Tourism Ready

Wine Australia has launched a free online course to help Australian wineries welcome back international travellers. <u>Wine Tourism Ready</u> provides expert guidance in six modules, with 21 wine-specific tourism lessons covering topics ranging from establishing experiences to mastering marketing for global audiences. Prior to COVID-19, Tourism Research Australia estimated one in eight international tourists to Australia visited at least one winery in 2018-19.

The iconic Old Bar Beach Festival is back over the October Long Weekend...register for the kombi parade or join the team and volunteer to help make this awesome day happen.


