Nature-Based Tourism Rebounds In NSW

Destination NSW has released a new report - **Domestic Nature-Based Tourism in NSW** - that reveals the state welcomed 29.6 million domestic visitors seeking outdoor and nature experiences in 2022, up more than 35.% on 2021.

Nature-based tourism is a market segment based around outdoor and nature experiences. It includes activities such as visiting national parks, whale or dolphin watching, going to the beach, visiting botanical gardens, visiting farms, bushwalking and/or rainforest walks, visiting wildlife parks, zoos and/or aquariums and bird watching. Natural beauty and wildlife are important factors for domestic and international visitors when choosing a holiday destination.

Of notable interest in the report, the North Coast is NSW's top regional destination for nature-based domestic overnight tourism.

Walks Near Me Digital Maps

Discovering great new walks and public spaces across the state has never been easier with the launch of a new online tool to connect people to iconic locations, including parks, beaches, libraries, museums, and exciting high streets.

The free *Walks Near Me* interactive digital map has thousands of opportunities to discover great public spaces across the state and create bespoke walking itineraries to visit them.

The tool brings together spatial data from across the state into a single digital tool which can be found on the nsw.gov.au website and is optimised for mobile phone use. People can create personalised walks, then save and share their favourites with their friends and family.

The new tool is home to more than 800 walks and offers a range of resources, including sharing the stories and history of a park or region, discovering events, and informing people about the amenities and experiences available.

The Walks Near Me digital map will be updated regularly on points of interest and route options.

Walks Near Me was developed in partnership between Transport for NSW and the Department of Customer Service's OneCX Program, which makes it easier to find, use, and understand information from the NSW Government.

Disaster Ready Fund Projects Announced

NSW will be better protected and prepared for future disasters following the announcement of 19 projects funded under Round One of the Federal Government's new Disaster Ready Fund. They include delivery of risk reduction equipment, a critical evacuation centre and early warning systems in Western NSW; works to reduce flood and erosion risks in the Lismore river catchment on the North Coast; and strategic partnerships with Aboriginal communities and organisations to reduce the risk and impact of disasters.

More Than \$4 Million For Art And Culture

More than 1.2 million people across NSW will experience a range of cultural activities and programs thanks to an investment of more than \$4.1 million from the NSW Government's Arts and Cultural Funding Program. NSW artists and organisations submitted a total of 424 applications, making this latest round of funding one of the largest from the sector in both volume and value. The 45% increase compared to the previous year signals the NSW arts and cultural sector is experiencing a resurgence in confidence to create exceptional art and cultural programs again after the disruption of COVID-19. Tourism Industry Insights

TRA Monthly Snapshot

Tourism Research Australia's (TRA's) monthly snapshot for March 2023 has been released. This report compares the month of March 2023 with the pre-pandemic month of March 2019. March 2023 saw nights away and spend exceed pre-pandemic levels in Australia. Spend was up 32% (\$2.1 billion) on March 2019 to \$8.5 billion. Visitors spent 31.7 million nights away, which was up 4% compared to March 2019. Domestic overnight spend in NSW was up 27% on 2019.

TRA also produces **<u>quarterly</u>** and <u>**annual**</u> summaries.

Quarterly Tourism Labour Statistics

Australian Bureau of Statistics data shows there were 727,200 tourism jobs in Australia during the March quarter of 2023 (up 6.4% year on year), accounting for one in 21 (4.8%) filled jobs in the economy. There were 30,300 (-4%) less jobs than December quarter 2019, prior to COVID-19. The industries that recorded the largest quarterly changes were cafes, restaurants and takeaway food services (8.5%), retail trade (7%) and education and training (21.7%). Household Spending Growth Slows

Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) data shows household spending growth has slowed. ABS head of business indicators Kate Lamb said: "From a peak of 29.1% in August 2022, this month's 6% growth has followed a downward pattern from an 11.9% rise in February and an 8.4% rise in March. This is mainly due to lower growth in spending on consumer services, like holiday travel and eating out, which continues to normalise." In NSW, spending in hotels, cafes and restaurants rose 13.7%. April 2023 Overseas Arrivals

New Australian Bureau of Statistics data shows Australia welcomed 544,920 short-term visitors in 2023. The number of trips for April 2023 was 22.2 per cent lower than the pre-COVID-19 level in April 2019. There were 200,230 short-term visitor arrivals to NSW. The three leading source countries for NSW were: New Zealand (33,380 trips), the United States (21,920) and the United Kingdom (16,290). Find more information here.

Increase to Minimum Wage and Award Wages

The Fair Work Commission (FWC) has published its <u>Annual Wage Review 2022-23</u> announcing a 5.75% increase in all modern awards, effective from the first full pay period on or after 1 July 2023. The National Minimum Wage has also been increased from \$21.38 per hour to \$23.23, an effective increase of 8.65%.

Funding And Other Opportunities

Country Arts Support Program

Country Arts Support Program (CASP) is an annual small grants program that aims to support community arts and cultural development in regional NSW through small grants that:

- Assist locally determined community arts and cultural activities and opportunities for regionally based groups to access a diverse range of arts programs
- · Enable communities to explore and express their cultural identities
- Bring social and economic benefits to the community through training employment and promotional opportunities
- · Lead to greater awareness and appreciation of cultural diversity
- Increase the sustainability and resilience of regionally based community arts organisations.

Grants of \$500 - \$2,500 are available primarily for professional artists' fees, art materials, venue hire, travel and accommodation. Projects are to take place between 1 August 2023 to 31 January 2024. Closes 30 June 2023.
