### Northern Rivers Rail Trail Delivering Economic Benefits For The Tweed

The results are in! The Tweed section of the Northern Rivers Rail Trail (NRRT) has surpassed expectations, boosting the Tweed economy by more than \$3.7 million in its first year of operation.

An independent <u>Economic Impact Assessment Report</u> by Muller Enterprise, commissioned by Tweed Shire Council and the Northern Rivers Joint Organisation, analysed the benefits of the Rail Trail to the Tweed since opening on 1 March 2023. Key findings of the report include:

- The Tweed section has attracted significant visitor spending, driving a 15.7% average increase in monthly spend compared to the previous year and stimulated growth in unique visitors (+23% year-over-year) and visitor transactions (+19% year-over-year).
- Businesses along the trail reported increased visibility, foot traffic and in many cases, higher revenues in both Murwillumbah and less-frequented hinterland villages.
- The total value of visitor spend has increased by \$3.717 million compared to the previous year. This far exceeds the anticipated boost of \$2.45 million that was forecast.
- The local economy should expect an additional \$114.3 million in visitor expenditure flowing into the Tweed LGA over the term of the rail corridor lease (30 years) representing a 54% increase over the originally anticipated boost to the local visitor economy.

## **Latest Data for NSW Caravan & Camping**

The NSW caravan and camping visitor economy showed growth in the year ending March 2024, with **4.85 million** overnight trips and **18.7 million visitor nights** recorded. This marks a 1% increase in trips and a 3% increase in visitor nights compared to the previous year. While visitor expenditure rose by 1%, average spend per trip and per night both decreased by 1% and 3%, respectively. Find more information here.

### **Regional Tourism Satellite Accounts 2022-23**

The <u>Regional Tourism Satellite Accounts 2022-23</u> present annual economic and jobs data for Australia's 76 tourism regions. This important release quantifies the relative importance of tourism in each of these regions, as well as changes from the previous financial year.

In 2022-23 gross value added (GVA) and filled jobs grew in 74 of 76 tourism regions. At a national level, direct tourism GVA grew by 74.5% and filled jobs grew by 41.5% in 2022-23, when compared with 2021-22.

# **Funding And Other Opportunities**

### **Revive Live - Grant Program**

Funding is available for activities that support established live music venues or established music festivals, creating a sustainable operating environment to protect performance opportunities, and the development and discoverability of original contemporary music by Australian artists. The Program also has a strong focus on activities that improve accessibility at established live music venues or established music festivals, providing participation opportunities for audiences, and career pathways for musicians and music workers, with disability.

The grant opportunity will run from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025.

Applications for grant funding will be accepted under two streams:

- 1. Live music venues with a maximum grant amount of \$100,000.
- 2. Music festivals with a maximum grant amount dependent on proven audience size. **Closes 23 August 2024**.

## **Contemporary Music Touring Program**

The Contemporary Music Touring Program (CMTP) supports national touring activity undertaken by Australian musicians performing original Australian contemporary music. **Closes 3 September 2024.**
