NSW Budget Update

The 2025-26 NSW Budget has been delivered with Destination NSW securing \$323.1 million to drive visitor demand, support world-class experiences and strengthen the state's position as Australia's home of major events.





NSW Breaks Records

Strategic investments in aviation access, major events and world-class visitor experiences have delivered a record result for international visitor expenditure in NSW.

Regional NSW also saw strong growth, particularly from international travellers visiting friends and relatives. The regions welcomed 700,000 international visitors (up 4.5 per cent), who stayed 17.7 million nights (up 15.8 per cent) and spent \$1.2 billion (up 10.5 per cent).



Fast-Tracking Zero Emissions for Commercial Aviation

Australia's transport sector is the third-largest source of greenhouse gas emissions, contributing 21% to the nation's total emissions. Without urgent intervention, the transport sector is projected to be Australia's largest source of emissions by 2030.

Dovetail Electric Aviation is making ground-breaking strides in reducing Australia's greenhouse gas emissions by pioneering the development of electric-powered aircraft. The company has been awarded a \$3 million Cooperative Research Centres Project (CRC-P) grant. This will lead to the first certified electric propulsion and energy system in its category, a significant milestone in Australia's transition to zero-emission aviation.
